


































































The World

Tulsi Mehar Shresthawas a well-known personality in the field of social work in Nepal. He was driven to India by Ranas, he got an opportunity to work closely with Mahatma Gandhi. In that moment he learnt many experiences with spinning and weaving techniques. Later he returned to Nepal and established an organization called "Charkha Pracharak Gandhi Smarak Mahaguthi" and shared the skill with the people for self dependence.



He also established residential type of training for sewing, weaving, knitting, etc. to the destitute women. He was given 'Neharu award' for international understanding and recognition for his social service.



...introduced wireless internet technology to develop the education and economic tandard of Nepali people living in the remote hilly district of Myagdi. He fulfilled the need of modern computer education to the school children of Nangi and nearby villages. He has developed communication links for yak farmers, as well as new venture to attract international
